

Temperature Scarf

Materials Needed:

Yarn: Kraemer Perfection DK weight. 11 chosen colors for high and low temps

Needles: US Size 7 or 8

Notions: Tapestry needle

Using 1 row of high and 1 row of low temperatures each day, we anticipate this being a very long scarf, you can make a hat or mitts along the line, using the same color plan along the line to shorten the scarf.

Starting :

Cast on 33 stitches

You can make it wider, or narrower—the repeat is 12 stitches, plus add an additional 9 stitches. We have cast on 2 repeats (24 stitches), plus 9 stitches, for a total of 33 stitches.

Knit 2 Rows (January 1 high and low)

Pattern:

Knit one row with the low temp assigned color, and one row with the high temp assigned color.

Row 1 (and all RS/odd rows): (K4, yo, K1, yo, DD), 2 times, K4, yo, K1, yo, K4 (35 stitches)

Row 2 (and all WS/even rows): P2 togtbl, purl to last 2 stitches, p2tog

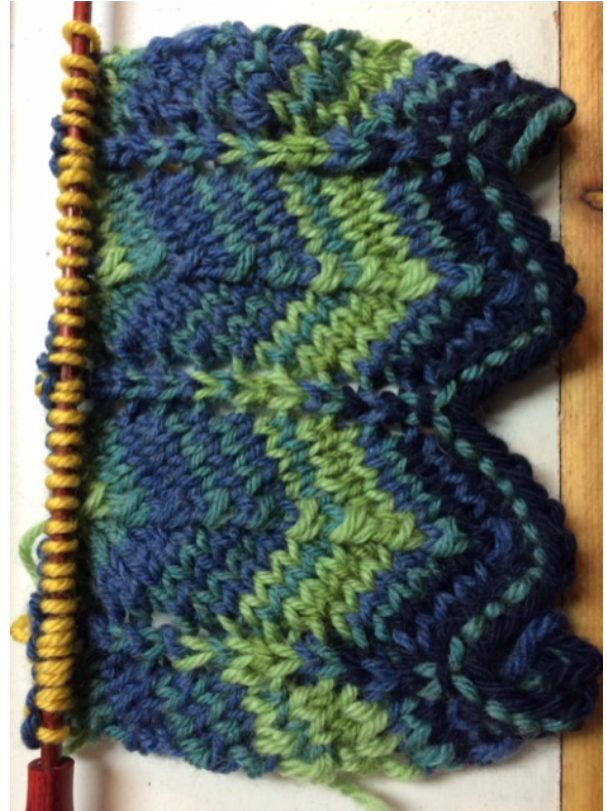
Repeat these 2 rows every day, on last day of year, knit last 2 rows

Will need to be blocked, to get the chevrons neatly at the end of the scarf.

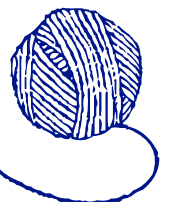
Notes:

- DD - Double Decrease: slip 2 stitches knitwise together, K1, pass 2 stitches over
- p2togtbl - purl 2 stitches together through the back loop
- p2tog - purl 2 stitches together
- yo - yarn over
- Knit ends in, or weave them in regularly!
- Brown County, Indiana temps will be posted on our FaceBook page, and website regularly.

To make with Wildfoote Sock Yarn, use US size 5, and cast on 45 stitches, or desired amount using above instructions.
